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THE UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

The Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University was set up with a notification by the government of Assam dated 24th May, 2011 of the Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University Act, 2011, which received assent of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam on 16th March, 2011. The Preamble of the Act states, "by this act, the government of Assam goes to establish and constitute a teaching, affiliating, research and residential university at Nalbari". The University is so named, as Kumar Bhaskar Varma, a great monarch of Assam of 7th century AD was a patron of Sanskrit Studies and during his rule, Vedic culture and Sanskritic knowledge came to flourish in Assam. It is the only Sanskrit university in the North Eastern region of India. As per Executive Council Resolution, the date of establishment of the University is 15th November, 2011. It adopted a Kalidasian line-"SaraswatiSrutimahatamMahiyatam" meaning "May the sayings of the wise be glorified" as its motto. The University initially functioned from its temporary campus at Nalbari College. Subsequently, the State Government allotted 100 Bighas (33 Acres) of land for setting up the permanent campus at Namati village, Nalbari District. The University shifted to its permanent campus on August 3rd, 2015. The University stands for imparting education leading to graduate and post-graduate degrees and research degrees viz. M.Phil. and Ph.D in Sanskrit and only research degrees in Ancient Studies. It also offers academic and research programmes under the School of Humanities as per societal requirements. It seeks to explore knowledge, disseminate quality education and popularize Sanskrit in the region and among its people. To that end, the University offers Post-Graduate Programmes in Sanskrit (Sahitya), Sanskrit (Vedic Studies), Integrated MA in Sanskrit, Assamese, Education, Philosophy and Political Science, M.Phil Programmes in Sanskrit (Sahitya), Education and Political Science, Post-Graduate Diploma in Gandhian Studies (PGDGS) and Certificate Courses on Computer Application, Sasvarvedapatha, Karmakanda Prashikshanam and Yogic Science. Subsequent to a recent amendment of the University Act, sustenance and the development of Traditional Sanskrit education of the state is another important task that the University performs.

The University stands for imparting education leading to graduate and post graduate degrees and research degrees viz. M.Phil. and Ph. D. in Sanskrit and only research degrees in Ancient Studies. At the same time, with the provision of the Act, the university is going to introduce academic programmes in Humanities, Social Sciences as well as other disciplines as per societal requirements.

CORE VALUES

The core values of the University are-

- Appreciation of the Sanskrit based ancient Indian Knowledge System as relevant in present day context.
- Connecting ancient Indian values based on Sanskrit literature with modern values.
- Creating a society based on pure and eternal knowledge.
- Developing inherent potentialities of individual.
- Conducting scientific and credible research linking with Sanskrit based Indian Knowledge System.
- Carrying on Sanskrit based ancient Indian legacy to the next generation.

ADMINISTRATION

The University is established as a teaching, affiliated, research and residential state university. Besides offering programmes under the School of Sanskrit Studies and the School of Humanities, the process has been initiated for making the School of Ancient Studies functional. Moreover, since 2017, the University is involved in the process of administering the academic aspect of Sanskrit Tols in Assam.

The Hon'ble Governor of Assam acts as the Chancellor of the University. The Vice-Chancellor heads the University and is guided by the Executive Council in taking decisions. In turn, the office of the Registrar executes the decisions in consultation with the Vice-Chancellor on matters of development and administration. The Academic Council looks after the syllabus, reforms or changes in syllabus, research and extension activities and other allied academic matters. Both Executive Council and Academic Council work under the University Court.

The organizational structure, provision for different administrative posts and their functions are clearly delineated in the University Act. The organizational structure of the University includes—

1. The Chancellor: As being a state University, the Governor of Assam is the Chancellor of the University

2. Vice-Chancellor: The Governor of Assam in his capacity as the Chancellor appoints the Vice Chancellor based on the recommendations of an Advisory Board. The Vice-Chancellor is the exofficio member and Chairman of the Executive Council, Academic Council and Construction Committee and ex-officio member of the University Court.

3. Registrar: The Registrar is appointed by the Executive Council and serves as an ex-officio member of the University Court as well as member Secretary of the Executive Council, Academic Council and the Construction Committee. The Registrar monitors the administrative as well as academic activities, records and infrastructure of the University.

4. Treasurer: The Treasurer of the University is appointed by the Executive Council. The office of the Treasurer monitors the financial aspect and offers policy inputs regarding the financial decision of the University.


5. Controller of Examinations: The Controller of Examinations looks after the issues related to examinations including filling up of form, conduct of examination, declaration of result and award of the mark-sheets and certificates.


6. Court: The Court is the highest enforcing authority of the University. The Court reviews the broad policies and programmes of the University and suggests measures for the improvement and implementation of such policies and programmes.

7. Executive Council: The Executive Council is the chief executive body of the University. The composition, power and functions of the Executive Council are clearly laid down in the University Act. Its powers range from instituting and conferring degrees, fellowships and scholarships to that of appointment of the officers and teachers of the University.

8. The Academic Council: The Academic Council approves matters related to academic issues including revision of curriculum, courses and examination.

9. Board of Studies: The Board of Studies is concerned with academic matters including curriculum assessment and its revision for the respective departments. It is composed of faculty members representing the particular Department and an external expert consultant.

The Department of Sanskrit (Sāhitya) started its journey with introduction of two years PG programmme in Sanskrit (Sahitya) with 21 students in 2013 in the temporary campus of Nalbari College. The five year Integrated M.A. in Sanskrit (IMS) was started in 2014 with the

enrolment of 19 students. At the initial stage Dr. Kamal Lochan Atreya and Dr. Pranab Jyoti Deka rendered service as contractual teachers where Dr. K.L. Atreya acted as Course Coordinator of the department of Sanskrit (Sāhitya) till October, 2015. Apart from this two faculty members, Dr. Basanta Kr. Dev Goswami, Dr. Mani Sarmah and Dr. Goutam Choudhury, Dr. Chabilal Upadhayaya, Dr. Nurima Yeasmin rendered service as Guest Faculty in the department. Dr. Ratul Bujar Baruah joined the department as Associate Professor in 2015 and since October, 2015 he has been serving as Head of the Department. At present, apart from two Associate Professors, there are four Assistant Professors and one Academic Consultant in the department. RESEARCH ACTIVITES

The University started its research programme in the year 2019. A total number of 12 research Scholars have been admitted to the M. Phil Programme through the KBV-RET (Research Entrance Test) purely based on merit. The research programmes have been started in the departments of Sanskrit (Sahitya), Education and Political Science. 4 research Scholars in the department of Sanskrit (Sahitya), 5 research scholars in the department of Education and 3 research Scholars in the department of political science have been admitted in the academic session. On the other hand, a total number of 5 faculty members have been allotted guide-ship based on fulfillment of eligibility criteria laid under UGC Regulation-2018 (Sanskrit (Sahitya)-2, Education-2 and Political Science-1).

CENTRES/CELLS/FORUM

Pre-Examination Training Centre

The Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University institutionalized the Pre-Examination Training Centre in the year 2019 to help the students prepare for competitive examinations including UGC-NET/JRF, SLET and other national and state level examinations. The pre-examination Training Centre has successfully organized six months duration course during 2020-21 academic sessions. The objective of the programme was to guide students for UGC NET/JRF examinations and for other civil service examinations. The University authority has given the responsibility to the Department of Philosophy as nodal department for smooth functioning and management of the whole programme. A committee has also been formed with the approval of Honourable Vice-chancellor. In this committee, Dr Hemendra Sarma, Registrar and Dr Susanta Kumar Kashyap, Controller of Examination are made advisers and Dr Bikash Bhargab Sarma, HoD, Dept. of Philosophy, Dr Papori Baruah, Assistant professor, Department of philosophy are included as members. Dr Tapan Talukdar, Assistant Professor of the Department of philosophy has been given the responsibility of coordinator of this training centre.

In this academic session, 35 numbers of students have been enrolled. The Course was successfully run for a duration of 6 months including 60 class hours. From the students' feedback, it becomes clear that such training programme is very much important for the upliftment of their career. As part of regular classes, the pre-examination training centre has also organised some additional programmes in collaboration with other agencies for the personality development of the students. In these programmes the centre has encouraged other students of the university apart from enrolled students. Centre has organised one day Workshop on Career Guidance on 22nd March, 2021, in Collaboration with Enlighten Civil Service Academy, Nalbari.

As part of its best practices, the Centre has taken the initiatives to give free admission for the academically outstanding students.

Women's Forum

The Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University is gender sensitive and the University aims at making the place a safe and secure place to live and work in for women. The Women's Forum of the University was formed on 2^{nd} of March 2018. The forum celebrates International Women's Day every year highlighting some relevant issues. It also organizes other gender sensitizing programmes at different times.

Centre for South East Asian Studies

The Centre for South East Asian Studies was established in the University in the year 2020. The Department of Political Science has been rendered the nodal department for running the Centre and appointed Dr Nandita Khakhlary, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science as the co-ordinator. The University was selected as one of the five universities in the state, by the

Department of Act East Policy, Government of Assam for establishment of a **Centre for South East Asian Studies.** Under the initiatives of the Centre, various programmes like webinars have been initiated since the time of its inception. The Centre adopted a resolution for initiating steps to undertake student exchange programme with Thammasat University, Bangkok and University of Yangon, Myanmar as soon as possible.

ACTIVITIES & ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE FACULTY MEMBERS

The University encourages its teachers to serve the society by participating in the live commentaries/ lectures/ discussion programmes/ on the print and electronic media, thereby giving their neutral opinion on relevant issues and rendering insights for readers and viewers. However, the University urges the concerned teachers not to make any remark or write anything that is contradictory to the code of conduct documented by the University for teachers. The faculty members also participate in various seminars, webinars, Orientation Programmes, Refresher Courses, FDPs, Conferences, Lecture Programmes, etc.. Faculty members of the University are also invited to deliver Public Talks, act as Resource Persons in academic programmes in Schools, colleges and Universities and record academic lectures as online content at certain governmental educational bodies including SCERT. The faculty members also participate in extension activities and some of them also make documentaries and short films on different social issues.

STUDENTS' COUNCIL

Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University has a Student Council and it is committed to 'Promote mental, moral, physical, cultural and social advancements of the Students'. For the first time in 2016, a Student Council was formed on an ad-hoc basis to conduct Varsity Festival and other student affairs. A full-fledged Student Council was formed in 2017 through democratic election including the portfolios of General Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Literary Secretary, Game Secretary, Social Service Secretary, Girls' Common Room Secretary and Department Representative for each department. In 2019, the post of President was created in the Student Council to strengthen their functional capacity. In 2020, the draft constitution of Student Council has been adopted. The *Chatra Sansad* is actively involved in developmental activities as well as the different academic and administrative activities of the University.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University Alumni Association in short 'KBVS&ASU Alumni Association' was formed on 3rd May, 2019. Since the time of its formation, the association has been working for the development of the University through

different activities. A virtual Alumni Meet on Google Meet platform was organized on the theme "Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit aru Puratan Adhyayan Viswavidyalaya: Smriti aru Xopun" on 27th September 2020.

EMPLOYEES' WELFARE

- *Faculty Quarters*: Keeping in view the welfare of the faculty members, the University completed the construction of four Assam Type Faculty Quarters in the session. The process of allotting quarters will be started shortly.
- *Teachers' Association*: The Adhoc Teachers' Association of the University has been functional since 2018. The Association has been raising certain issues relating to the academic and infrastructural issues of the University as well as the issues related to the faculty members. As part of its social responsibility orientation, the Association has contributed generously to Chief Ministers Flood Relief Fund in 2019, Chief Ministers' Arogya Nidhi Fund during Covid-Pandemic in 2020 as well as provided relief materials to the flood affected nearby villagers of the University. The Constitution of the Association was enacted and adopted recently and the process of formally institutionalizing the Association has been initiated.
- *Non-Teaching Association*: KBVS&AS University Employees Association was established in the year 2017

STUDENTS' WELFARE & FACILITIES

Sudhalata Duarah Girls' Hostel: The Girls' Hostel of the University provides accommodation to the female students of the University. The hostel is located within the University compound and students are provided accommodation based on their merit and distance from home. The Sudhalata Duarah Girls' Hostel has a total seat capacity of 144. In the session 2020-21, 84 Girls have been allotted seats in the hostel.

Transportation Facilities: Since the University is located in a rural area the University approached the Transport Ministry for availing an ASTC Bus for smooth commutation of its working staff as well as students. As such, the students and faculty members of the University have been availing the service of an ASTC bus with its fixed route between Nalbari town and the University.

Buildings: The University is functioning in two Academic blocks and one Administrative building; one RCC building as girls' hostel, one *Yagnashala* and an UBI ATM attached to the University campus.

Girls' Common Room:

The University has an overwhelming presence of girl students across different programmes. Keeping in sight the privacy and comfort of the girl students, a Girls' Common room at the University with the basic facilities like wash room, well furnished bed, chairs, mirror, fast-aid kit, sanitary pads has been allotted. It is located in the academic block of the University so that it is easily accessible to the female students of the University.

University Canteen:

The University has a canteen at its disposal, the catering service of which is leased out based on a fair process. The University has a committee in place that looks after the issues related to the canteen, monitors the prices related to edible items and ensures hygiene and quality of food served in it.

Sports Facilities:

The University has provided for sports facilities including a football playground, a volleyball court, a badminton Court and the necessary equipments. Further, as part of annual varsity festival, the University allows its students to participate in different outdoor sports and games including football, Kabadi, Cricket, Volleyball, Tug of War, Sprints, Badminton, High jump, etc.

Sporting equipments are accessible to the students round the year. The Sports Committee looks after the sports related activities and maintains the playground.

NSS

The University has a National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit which was established in 2020. Dr. Gunin Saikia, Assistant Professor, Department of Assamese is the Co-ordinator of NSS. There is an Unit with 100 volunteers under the NSS Unit.

The aims of NSS Unit are-

- 1. To develop the personality of students through community service.
- 2. Integrating higher education to community service.
- 3. To offer unique opportunities for the institutions of higher education to become instruments of change and development.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Classrooms: At present, there are 21 classrooms in total, out of which 2 (1+1 VC's Conference Hall) Classrooms are ICT-enabled.

ICT Facilities: The University has provided for Wi-Fi facilities in its academic and administrative blocks as well as the University library. ICT facilities like audio-visual devices including Projector have been provided in the VC's Conference hall and ICT Classroom cum Seminar Hall in the administrative block. All the departments have been provided with a departmental desktop and fully functional Wi-Fi facility. Apart from these, Smart-boards have been installed in four classrooms. The Computer lab of the University is located in the administrative building. It is open for use by the students. A Certificate Course on Computer Application is also offered by the University.

Facilities for Divyanjan (Differently-abled): Being sensitive to the needs of the *Divyanjan* (Differently-abled), the University is committed to make them comfortable within the campus. The buildings of the University have ramps and railings at their entry points. A wheel-chair is available to be used whenever required. There is also the provision of scribes for writing examinations.

Yajnashala: The University has a *Yajnashala* for academic Purpose where the practical classes of Diploma of Karmakanda and also the other classes related to various issues of ethical and spiritual are held from time to time.

Yoga cum Meditation Center

The University has a Yoga cum meditation Center located in the new academic building where regular classes of PG Diploma in Yogic Science and Therapy and also Certificate course in Yogic Science are held as per the time schedule fixed by the centre.

LIBRARY & MANUSCRIPT REPOSITORY

The Mahamahopadhyay Dhireswaracharya Library of the University is a repository of rare books, manuscripts, Sanskrit and Shastric collections along with a number of books, journals, magazines and newspapers across Sanskrit, Hindi, English and Assamese Languages. Though in its infant stage, Currently the library is equipped with 8893 books, 5 periodicals and around 300 dissertations. Out of 8893 books, 6774 books are donated and 2119 books are purchased. The University has, in its disposal, more than 150 rare books. The University Library has provided the readers with selected journals, magazines and newspapers across Sanskrit, Hindi, English and Assamese Language. The University library also has Manuscript repository and display boxes with a number of manuscripts that are kept open for visitors. As part of its audio visual resources, the University has also stored CDs and DVDs for studying Vedas. The Library is Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) enabled with SOUL (Software for University Libraries) 2.0. The students are issued a Library Card for Issue and Return of books. A Logbook is maintained for Issue and Return of books by the teachers of the University.

Manuscript Repository: There is a manuscript repository attached with University Central Library for the benefit of the students. It has more than 100 manuscripts in its disposal. These valuable documents are collected from different districts like Nalbari, Nagaon, Silchar etc. The doneers gave their valuable documents willing to the university. In return the doneers were only appreciated by an appreciation letter by the University authority. The names of the donners to the Manuscript repository are-
