#### 1. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

The Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University stands for imparting education leading to graduate, post graduate degrees as well as research

degrees. The University was set up with a notification by the Government of Assam dated May 25<sup>th</sup>, 2011 of the Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University Act,



2011. The preamble of the Act states that by this Act, "The Government of Assam goes to establish and constitute a teaching, affiliating, research and residential University at Nalbari, the Headquarters of the district of Nalbari, Assam. The University has been included under regulation 12B of UGC and received NAAC Accreditation with B+ Grade.

Kumar Bhaskar Varma, a great monarch of Assam (7<sup>th</sup> century A.D.) was a patron of Sanskrit studies and during his rule Vedic culture and Sanskritic knowledge came to flourish in Assam. The campus of the University is developed at Namati village of Batahgila Mouza under Nalbari Revenue Circle of the district of Nalbari, Assam. It has an area of 100 bhigas of land allotted by the Government of Assam. It is easily accessible by public and private transport facilities.

- Developing inherent potentialities of individual.


- Conducting scientific and credible research linking with Sanskrit based

#### 4. ADMINISTRATION:



Prof. Dipak Kumar Sharma, as first Vice-Chancellor contributed significantly to its development from November 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2011 till August 4<sup>th</sup> 2022.

#### 7. CENTRES / CELLS / FORUM

## **❖ Internal Quality Assurance Cell**

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the University was institutionalized on 27.09.2019. In a short span of time, it has significantly contributed to the institutionalization of quality assurance strategies and processes. The IQAC has initiated certain measures that will benefit the university fraternity especially in the field of academics. It undertakes various programmes for that purpose.

On 28<sup>th</sup> April, 2023, the IQAC, Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit And Ancient Studies University and IQAC, Krishna Kanta Handiqe Govt. Sanskrit College jointly organized Orientation Programme on FYUG Programme in Sanskrit according to NEP 2020 at KKHGS College, Guwahati.

On 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2023 IQAC and NSS Unit of Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit And Ancient Studies University organized a Webinar on "Solutions to Plastic Pollution" to observe World Environment Day, 2023.

## **Pre-examination Training Centre**

The Pre-Examination Training Centre of Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University, Namati, Nalbari was established to guide the students of the University for preparing UGC NET/JRF examinations and for other civil service examinations. The Department of Philosophy is the nodal department for smooth functioning and management of the Centre. The functioning of the Centre is looked after by a Committee approved by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. Dr. Tapan Talukdar, Assistant Professor of the Department of Philosophy is currently serving as the coordinator of the Centre.

In the current academic session, 42 number of students have been enrolled. The resource persons are invited from various reputed institutions, such as Gauhati

University, IITG, OKD etc. to guide the students. Internal resource persons are also engaged for the purpose.

#### **❖** Women's Forum

The Women's Forum of the Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University was formed on 02/03/2018. The Forum organized a Poster Making Competition on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2023 among the students of KBVS&AS University on the theme 'DigitALL: Innovation and Technology for Gender Equality' and also celebrated International Women's Day on 14<sup>th</sup> of March 2023.

#### **!** Centre for South East Asian Studies

The University established the Centre for South East Asian Studies in the year 2020. The University was selected as one of the five universities in the state, by the Department of Act East Policy, Government of Assam for establishment of a Centre for South EastAsian Studies. Under the initiatives of the Centre, various programmes like webinar have been initiated since the time of its inception. The Committee for the Centre for South East Asian Studies, in its meeting held on 15/09/2020 adopted a resolution for initiating steps to undertake student exchange programme with Thammasat University, Bangkok and University of Yangon, Myanmar.

#### **❖** Sanskrit Vikas Kendram

The Sanskrit Vikash Kendram was established on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2023. Dr. Ranjeet Kumar Tiwary is the Coordinator of the Centre. Sanskrit Bal Kendram is a part of Sanskrit Vikas Kendram and Ms. Rituparna Sarma is teachers in the Sanskrit



Bal Kendram. The Centre is taking classes of Spoken Sanskrit for 82 primary and high school students of the nearby villages of the University. The Centre was renamed as Kanakalata Boruah Sanskrit Bal Kendram on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2023.

This cell is institutionalized for redressing the grievances related to examinations and academic matters.

#### 8. NSS

The University has a National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit which was established in 2020. Dr. Gunin Saikia, Assistant Professor, Department of Assamese is the Coordinator of NSS. #### 10. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

For providing equality of opportunity to all and ensuring quality outcome, the University has adopted an open entrance system for admission to PG and PhD programmes. As such candidates willing to take admission into PG programmes have to qualify KBVPGET and the aspiring PhD candidates will have to qualify the KBV-RET. Further, the aspiring PhD candidates have to appear in viva-voce before final selection for PhD admission. On the other hand, admission into the integrated Masters programme is done on merit basis.

#### 11. EXAMINATION PROCEDURE AND DATA

The university has a centralized examination management system through which the end-semester examinations are conducted. The examination procedures in the University have been upgraded from time to time which encompasses the use of IT and innovations that ensure transparency, confidentiality and efficiency of the examination procedures. For quality control, the University sets a good portion of questions papers by external Question setters from other Higher Educational institute. Question papers are dispatched to the Controller of Examinations by the paper-setters in the form of confidential emails or sealed envelopes which off-sets the possibility of breach of security. Moreover, the 'strong-room' located within the premises of his office ensures that all security concerns are addressed. It is noteworthy that instances

of tampering with or 'leaking' of question papers have not happened in the university.

#### 11.1. Reforms in the Examination Procedures

The examination system is a centralised system under the office of the Controller of Examination. The following reforms have been introduced in the examination procedure in recent period-

- The University ensures that results are declared within 15 days from the last date of the examination.
- The University has introduced Grading system since the academic year 2017-18.

## 11.2. Processes integrating IT

The examination procedure has been integrated with an IT enabled system through online applications for examination and online generation of admit cards ensuring efficiency and transparency. In the post-examination phase, Information Technology is used in result processing, result declaration as well as in application for revaluation by the students. The University follows a grading system, where the marks are calculated and converted into grades and mark-sheets and certificates are issued. The use of IT in this process has made certain that the margin of error is negligible and there is smooth and speedy declaration of results.

## 11.3. Continuous Internal Assessment System

The University has been following a semester system since the beginning. This system is premised on continuous internal assessment of students which takes place through home assignments, class attendance, seminar presentations, group discussions, field work and small projects. Besides the above there is one

sessional examination per semester. 20% marks in each Semester end examination comes from Internal Assessment. This 20% of marks come from Internal Assessment taken in the form of-

- Class attendance

- Group discussion/field studies/small projects
- Lab sessions

#### 26. STUDENTS' WELFARE & FACILITIES

- 26.1. Sudhalata Duarah Girls' Hostel: The Sudhalata Duarah Girls' Hostel of the University provides accommodation to the female students of the University. The hostel is located within the University compound and students are provided accommodation based on their merit and distance from home. The Sudhalata Duarah Girls' Hostel has a total seat capacity of 147. In the session 2022-23, 120 Girls have been allotted seats in the hostel. The hostel boarders enthusiastically organized various programmes in the session 2022-23 which are Independence Day, Janmastami, Games and Activities among newcomers (9<sup>th</sup> September 2022), Farewell (12<sup>th</sup> September 2022), Kati Bihu, Diwali, Freshmen Social (24<sup>th</sup> November 2022), New Year Celebration, Saraswati Puja, Republic Day, Holi and Eid.
- **26.2. Transportation Facilities:** The students and faculty members of the University have been availing the service of an ASTC bus with its fixed route between Nalbari town and the University. Further, the University also has a four wheeler vehicle for dealing with the contingent situations including medical and other emergencies.
- **26.3. Buildings:** The University is functioning in two Academic buildings and one Administrative building, one RCC building as girls' hostel, *Yagnashala* and UBI ATM attached to the University campus.
- **26.4. Girls' Common Room:** There is a Girls' Common room at the University with the basic facilities like wash room, well furnished bed, chairs, mirror,

- first-aid kit, sanitary pad dispenser etc. It is located in the academic block of the University so that it is easily accessible to the female students of the University.
- **26.5. Boy's Common Room:** There is a boy's common room at the university with the basic facilities like table and chair, Carrom Board and other indoor sports facilities. It is located at the academic block of the university so that it is easily accessible to the students of the University.
- **26.6. University Canteen:** The University has a canteen at its disposal, the catering service of which is leased out based on a fair process. The University has a committee in place that looks after the issues related to the canteen, monitors the prices related to edible items and ensures hygiene and quality of food served in it.
- **26.7. Sports Facilities:** The University has provided for sports facilities including a football playground, a volleyball court, a badminton Court and the necessary equipments. Further, as part of Annual Varsity festival, the University allows its students to participate in different outdoor sports and games including football, Kabadi, Cricket, Volleyball, Tug of War, Sprints, Badminton, High jump, etc. Sporting equipments are accessible to the students round the year. The Sports Committee looks after the sports related activities and maintains the playground.

#### 28. INFRASTRUCTURE

- **28.1. Classrooms:** At present, there are 33 classrooms in total, out of which 8 (7+1 VC's Conference Hall) Classrooms are ICT-enabled.
- 28.2. ICT Facilities: The University has provided for Wi-Fi facilities in its academic and administrative blocks as well as the University library. ICT facilities like audio-visual devices including Projector have been provided in the VC's Conference hall and ICT Classroom cum Seminar Hall in the administrative block. Further, there are six ICT enabled classrooms at the University, whilst all classrooms are Wi-Fi enabled. All the departments have been provided with a departmental desktop and fully functional Wi-Fi facility. Apart from these, Smart boards have been installed in four classrooms. The Computer lab of the University is located in the administrative building. It is open for use by the students. A Certificate Course on Computer Application is also offered by the University.
- **28.3.** Facilities for Divyanjan (Differently-abled): Being sensitive to the needs of the *Divyanjan* (Differently-abled), the University is committed to make them comfortable within the campus. The buildings of the University have ramps and railings at their entry points. There is provision for separate toilet for differently-abled on each floor of the new Academic building. A wheel-chair is available to be used whenever required. There is also the provision of scribes for writing examinations.
- **28.4. Yajnashala:** The University has a *Yajnashala* for academic Purpose where the practical classes of Diploma of Karmakanda and also the other classes related to various issues of ethical and spiritual are held from time to time.
- **28.5. Yoga cum Meditation Center:** The University has a Yoga cum meditation Center located in the new academic building where regular classes of PG Diploma in Yogic Science and Therapy and also Certificate course in Yogic Science are held as per the time schedule fixed by the Centre.

#### 29. LIBRARY & MANUSCRIPT REPOSITORY

The Mahamahopadhyay Dhireswaracharya Library of the University is a repository of rare books, manuscripts, Sanskrit and Shastric collections along with a number of books, journals, magazines and newspapers across Sanskrit, Hindi, English and Assamese Languages. Though in its infant stage, currently, the library has a collection of 12830 books, 8 periodicals, 3 free journals, 8 Newspapers and around 400 dissertations. The University Library has provided the readers with selected journals, magazines and newspapers across Sanskrit, Hindi, English and Assamese Language. Hon'ble MLA of Nalbari constituency and Cabinet Minister of Assam of Public Health Engineering, Skill, Employment & Entrepreneurship and Tourism Sri Jayanta Malla Baruah donated a huge number of books to the University library. Apart from these, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. Pralhad R. Joshi and Sri Jogeswar Sarma, Ex-Librarian of Gauhati University also donated books to the University library.

The University library also has Manuscript repository and display boxes for manuscripts that are kept open for visitors. As part of its audio visual resources, the University has also stored CDs and DVDs for studying Vedas. The Library is Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) enabled with SOUL (Software for University Libraries) 2.0. The students are issued a Library Card for Issue and Return of books. A Logbook is maintained for Issue and Return of books by the teachers of the University.

**29.1. Manuscript Repository:** The manuscript repository is attached with the University Central Library for the benefit of the students. It has about 474 manuscripts. 
