
KUMAR BHASKAR VARMA SANSKRIT AND ANCIENT STUDIES NALBARI, ASSAM As per quality assurance mechanism, the Internal Quality Assurance cell of the Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit and Ancient Studies University collected feedbacks from the students, alumni, faculty members as well as employers on curriculum of the University. The process was done by circulating google feedback form specifically prepared for the different stakeholders. An analysis of the responses of the stakeholders are presented below.


#### **Analysis of Responses of the faculty members**

As part of the curriculum feedback collection mechanism, a total 24 members of the faculty across 9 different programmes responded through the google form circulated by the IQAC. Out of the 24 faculty members, 5 respondents are Associate Professor, 17 are Assistant Professors and 2 are Guest faculty members. As such 20.9 % of the respondents are Associate Professor, 70.9% are Assistant Professor and 8.3% are Guest faculty members. Their recorded responses are as follows

#### 1. The syllabus/syllabi cover(s) most of the relevant issues

Out of the 24 respondents, 15 respondents strongly agreed that the syllabus/syllabi cover(s) most of the relevant issues which constitute 62.5% of the total responses. On the other hand, 9 respondents that constitute 37.5% of the feedbacks agreed to the question. A graphical representation of the responses is presented below.






#### 2. Rate the semester-wise arrangement of the course content of the program(s)


On being asked to rate the semester-wise arrangement of the course contents of the program (s), a total 18 number of respondents marked the course content as excellent which constitute 75% of the responses. On the other hand, 6 respondents constituting 25% of the total responses rated the content as good. A graphical representation of the data is presented below.

On being asked to make observation on the design of the syllabus/syllabi, 13 respondents considered it to be highly satisfactory which constitute about 54.2% of the responses. 


## 4. Is there any revision in the syllabus/syllabi of your subject during the last five years?

A total 23 number of respondents, out of the 24, which constitute 95.8% recorded that there was revision of syllabus during the last five years, while 1 respondent

constituting 4.8% respondent with the option no. A graphical representation of the data is presented below.


Is there any revision in the syllabus/syllabi of your subject during the last five years? <sup>24 responses</sup>

If yes, do you agree that the students are able to cope up with the revised syllabus? <sup>24 responses</sup>




## 6. Rate the applicability of the curriculum/curricula of the program(s) in the present-day context

Rate the applicability of the curriculum/curricula of the program(s) in the present day context. <sup>24 responses</sup>





#### Analysis of the responses of the students

As part of the curriculum feedback collection mechanism, a total 273 google form driven feedback responses were received from the students of the University. The analysis of their responses on the curriculum is given below

#### 1. The syllabus/syllabi cover(s) most of the relevant issues

On being asked whether the syllabus/syllabi cover(s) most of the relevant issues, 66 respondents, constituting 24.2% state that they strongly agree; 164 respondents constituting 60.1% state that they agree; 7 respondents constituting 2.6% state that they partially agree. On the other hand, 25 respondents constituting 9.2% have a neutral opinion while 11 respondents constituting 4% state that they do not agree that the syllabus covers most of the relevant issues. 




#### 2. Rate the Semester-wise arrangement of the course content

On being asked to assess the semester-wise arrangement of the course content, 82 respondents constituting 30% rate it as excellent; 182 respondents constituting 66.7% rate it as good and 8 respondents constituting 2.9% rate it as fair. A graphical representation of the responses is given below.


10. Rate the semester-wise arrangement of the course content. 273 responses


11. Your observation on the design of the syllabus 273 responses


12. Have you noticed any revision in the syllabus in comparison with the previous years? 273 responses


13. If Yes, have you been able to cope up with the revised portion of the syllabus? 273 responses




#### Analysis of the responses of the Alumni


#### 1. The syllabus covered most of the relevant issues

On being asked, whether the syllabus cover most of the relevant issues, 36 of the respondents constituting 39.6% respond that they strongly agree; 50 respondents constituting 54.9% respond that they agree; 3 respondents constituting 3.3% respond that they partially agree. On the other hand, 2 respondents constituting 2.2% disapprove of the fact that the syllabus cover most of the relevant issues. A graphical representation of the responses is given below.




#### 2. Rate the semester-wise arrangement of the course content




## 4. Did you get any revision in the syllabus in comparison with the previous year(s)?

constituting 26.4% respond as no. A graphical representation of the responses is presented below.


Did you get any revision in the syllabus in comparison with the previous year(s)? 91 responses


If yes, had you been able to cope up with the revised portion of the syllabus?

Rate the applicability of the curriculum of your program in the present day context 91 responses




#### **Analysis of the responses of the Employers**

#### 1. Are you aware of the syllabi of different programs of the university?


On being asked whether the respondents are aware of the syllabi of the different programmes of the University, both the respondents replied in affirmation. A graphical representation of the responses is given below.


Your observation on the design of the syllabus <sup>2</sup> responses

On being asked whether the respondents are aware of any revision of the syllabi during the last five years, both the respondents responded in affirmation. A graphical representation of the responses is given below.


Are you aware of any revision of the syllabi during last five years? <sup>2</sup> responses
